We currently lease the manse to Rev. Eustacia Moffett Marshall and her family. Rev. Marshall serves the New River Presbyterian Church. What follows is a brief description provided by Ruling Elder Lois Hayman-El from their Session:

The Mission of New River is to multiply leaders and disciples of Jesus who love God, love people, and serve the world because the love of Jesus makes all things flourish.

New River Presbyterian Church is the combination of three streams that has become one river (formerly First African Presbyterian, Calvin Presbyterian, and Good Shepherd Presbyterian). The three congregations committed themselves to coming together and remaining in West Philadelphia in service with that community.

We have a dynamic Pastor, Rev. Eustacia Moffett Marshall, who led us through the height of the pandemic. We developed online worship and Bible Study. We have vibrant worship. Music and art are a big part of the people experience.

Since Easter 2023, we worship in-person and online in the facility that was at formerly First African Presbyterian Church. We worked with Partners for Sacred Places, and developed a Community Advisory Council. Rev. Marshall has developed relationships with community organizations to partner with us. Rev. Marshall's installation as our permanent Pastor was held at the largest neighborhood high school.

We have a food cupboard. We have a Senior Emergency Fund to assist West Philadelphia residents as well as members of the congregation who are over 50 to address crises. We offer affordable space to the community to hold events. We partner with the University of Pennsylvania to provide a free clinic twice a month to deal with health, dental and social service needs in our facility. Our facility is used as a voting location. We aim to continue as a community hub and complete the restoration of our facility so that we can resume holding NA meetings, day care, and summer camp. We are in the process of developing a CDC to move us forward.

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## Mending the world one zipper at a time at Broad Street Ministry

A core group of volunteers set up shop every week at the nonprofit to fix clothing items brought in for repairs by people who are unhoused.

**Breaking Bread** A residential shelter in Upper Darby for unhoused adults. Organized by the student-run Emergency Housing Unit of Philadelphia, with support from Homeless Services Coalition for Delaware County.

Teams of Church members served meals and made donations of supplies to groups that have increased from 7 residents to about 20 over the course of the year. Boy Scout patrols from Troop 434 also took on the Breaking Bread project in 2024.

More than 700 lbs. of food and 100 lbs of clothing donated to Chester Eastside, Inc.

Red Cross Blood Drive Our October blood drive collected 38 units of blood, which could potentially save 114 lives in regional hospitals. A small herd of goats donated through Heifer International.

To our Supporters and Partners at Llanerch Presbyterian Church, greetings and blessings to you all. On behalf of the volunteers, staff, and board of Chester Eastside – but most of all the people we serve – I am writing to offer our deepest gratitude for the variety of ways you have supported our programs and services over many years.

As you may know, Chester Eastside was founded almost forty years ago by the Presbytery of Philadelphia. The original goal was to have a place of mission that was desperately in need that the congregations of the Presbytery would support. Last year nearly 40% of our overall revenue came from faith communities. With that support we provided over 143,000 meals last year. Our afterschool program continues to provide a refuge for students in our community every day from September to May. We still offer a summer camp, which serves up to 40 students, and operates throughout the month of July.

In these, and all our other programs, volunteers are the backbone of what we do. I am proud to say that the Presbytery's model initiated in 1985 continues to be a source of light, hope, learning, joy, and...

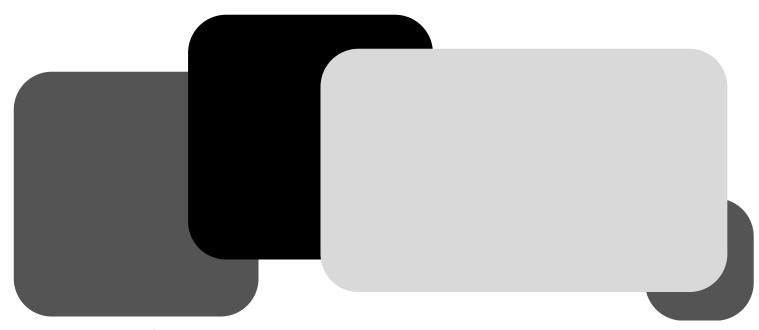
